Mr. Ammerman clarified that the policy presented represents computers that a student would take home. Currently only 2 special education students have these types of device. Computers in school are blocked. Mr. Ammerman will check with Ms. Budanskaya. From personal experience there are firewalls in place to prevent anything from happening. Another problem would be student's personal computers brought into school.

Mr. Esposito commented that in his district the student's personal device would go to the IT department first.

Mrs. Cravello stated that Hackensack found a lot of games were downloaded.

Mr. Ammerman stated you only need one person to do something silly. Five or six could ruin it for everyone else.

Mr. Allos added that in a small environment it should be easy to control it.

Mr. Scully stated that in a private area catholic school the parents pay for a laptop. He admitted he didn't know how the district controls it.

Mr. Esposito stated we have a few years before we get to that point.

Mr. Scully asked how it's blocked.

Mr. Esposito explained the process.

VI. Business Administrator's Report Dr. Occhino reported the following.

- The first six resolutions are resolutions that are listed each month, they deal with bills, payroll etc.
- There is a resolution for point of service; this allows a student to move through the lunch line at a faster pace. Basically a student ID is scanned-parents pay online. Parents will be able to see what our child ate or bought. Could be extended to pay fines directly. *Mrs. Leakas asked if it would be by family or individual*.

Dr. Occhino was not sure.

Mr. Esposito stated in his district its one account.

Dr. Occhino stated that the price for lunch is \$2.25 and reduced .40

- Dr. Occhino introduced two additional addendums- the first one deals with the cost of the referendum. The amount has to be put into the long range facilities plan. The building was assessed at 14 million that will be updated.
- Mr. Ammerman spoke on facility use forms. Organizations have requested use of the fields without the proper paperwork handed in. Every request must have an insurance rider attached and in the case of a contact sport or game, a concussion policy signed must accompany the request. Mr. Ammerman explained that having the proper paperwork is important should a legal matter arise. The district, organization and the person who signed off could all be liable. It's a problem and it needs to be done.
