Last month at the Board of Education meeting, the NJ Department of Education Spring 2022 Assessment Testing Report was presented. Some highlights from the presentation include:

- ✓ Data Teams



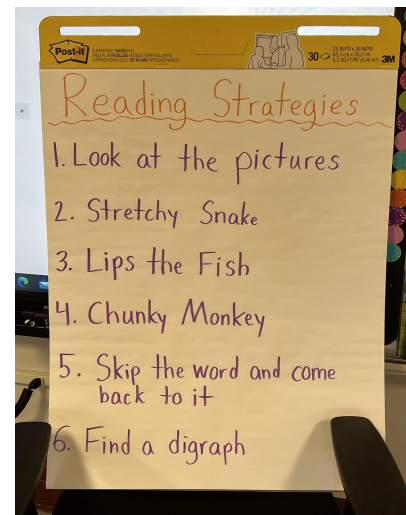

Balanced Literacy

The district is continuing to implement Balanced Literacy in English Language Arts (ELA) by incorporating the Reader's and Writer's Workshop models of teaching into the classrooms. The Reader's and Writer's Workshop focuses on teaching and strengthening skills and strategies for students to become independent learners. The components of the workshop model consist of the following:

- ✓ Mini-Lessons on a Skill/Strategy (in Reading and Writing)
- ✓ Independent Reading to help build stamina and practice mini-lesson
- ✓ Independent Writing to practice a skill or accomplish a certain task
- ✓ Conferencing (teacher-student)
- ✓ Sharing Student Work



Teachers have been working with Mrs. Brianne Annitti, a Literacy Coach from Gravity Goldberg since September 2021. Mrs. Annitti visits Midland School and supports the teachers with hands-on learning experiences, modeling of mini-lessons and/or conferencing strategies, individual coaching sessions, and reflection/debriefing. ***Our students are becoming stronger readers and writers!***


We encourage your child to select all five meal components for an appealing and satisfying lunch.

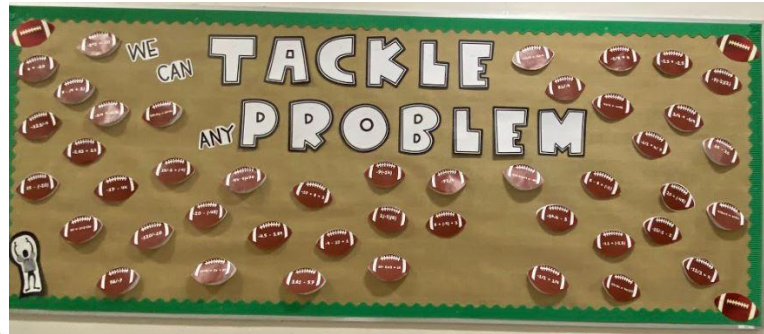
